

## **Candidate Statement, Christopher Stirn**

My name is Christopher Stirn and I am running to be a member of the SD DSA Steering Committee. I want to help make our chapter into an efficient organization that tackles the major problems in the San Diego region, by focusing on homelessness, immigration, and electoral politics.

With our ever expanding housing crises, I feel that the San Diego chapter can make actual lasting change that could serve as a framework for others to use. I propose our chapter begin with a three tiered approach, by first having members work with existing organizations such as habitat for humanity, secondly provide on the ground assistance to the homeless, and finally begin driving the political conversation towards the decommodification of housing in San Diego.

Additionally I would like our chapter to begin using our already considerable and rapidly growing membership to drive candidates for political office left, through providing targeted and effective campaign support of candidates that share our values, in order to prove that we are a active and politically conscience group that must be not only given lip service to, but must whose ideals must be considered.

What other organizations do you belong to or have belonged to that influence your identity as an activist/organizer? Do you currently hold office within any other organization(s)? If yes, which organization(s)?

*-No, I am currently fully committing my time to help make the San Diego DSA into a beacon for other socialist movements in Southern California and the rest of the USA.*

If elected to Steering Committee, what are some areas upon which you'd like to focus?

*-If elected I would like the local chapter to begin focusing in earnest on the local issues plaguing San Diego, chiefly homelessness, immigration, and electoral politics. By tackling these issues we can help provide a framework for what works to other communities in the state, and more importantly help make life better for our neighbors.*

What ideas do you have to ensure that Steering Committee decisions are made democratically?

*-I would ensure full democratic participation of the rank and file membership by devolving as many important roles to non-steering committee members as possible, for example treasurer, the heads of working groups, and national convention representatives, in order to flatten the leadership structure. In addition, I would propose that all steering committee decisions must be ratified by a 2/3 majority of the rank and file membership. As well as that any proposal that is supported by at least 1/3 of the membership must taken under consideration by the steering committee, with a proposal to the general membership returned by the next general meeting.*
